

Explaining QCE ATAR VET Pathwa

Session 2 of 3

QCE: Queensland Certificate of Education

- Awarded to eligible students (usually at the end of Year 12).
- Students must pass a minimum of 6 subjects
- Students must have a literacy and numeracy accreditation.
- Students may study school subjects and certificate courses as part of their QCE.
- Students need to achieve a satisfactory 'C' grade to gain credits towards their QCE.
- Students need to have banked 20 credits to gain their QCE (see handout)

ATAR

Australian Tertiary Admission Ranking

If you want to do a university course after year 12

- Most university courses require an **<u>ATAR</u>** score for entry
- Many university courses have pre-requisite subjects: e.g. General English and Maths Methods for Engineering; General English, a Maths and a Science subject for Primary Education
- Choose subjects that make you eligible for an ATAR or are prerequisites for your course
- Discuss/check pre-requisites at SET Plan Meeting



What is an ATAR? Australian Tertiary Admission Rank

Score used for admission to university Score between 99.5 (highest) and 1 (lowest)

Calculated using 5 general subjects OR 4 General subjects and 1 Applied subject OR 4 General subjects and 1 VET Certificate III course or higher



For Work/Apprenticeship/VET Pathways

- Students can choose a variety of subjects to support their future pathway.
- These can be a combination of General (Pink), Applied (Blue) or VET (Yellow) subjects.
- TAFE are offering two courses next year
- Students need to enrol themselves









English and Mathematics Subjects on offer Students must select and English and Mathematics

English

- English an General subject
- Literature- an General subject (offered on elective line)

General Subjects 'Pink Subjects'

Accounting, Biology, Chemistry, English, Dance, Drama, Geography, General Mathematics, Literature, Marine Science, Mathematical Methods, Music, Physical Education, Physics, Psychology, Visual Arts and Specialist Maths

- External exam at end of year 12
- Some university courses require some of these subjects as prerequisites
- Please see your copy of the Senior Subject Handbook



Applied Subjects 'Blue Subjects'

Agriculture, Aquatic Practices, Music in Practice, Visual Arts in Practices, Dance in Practice, Sport and Recreation, Media in Practice, Social and Community Studies, Early Childhood Studies and Fashion

- No external exam at end of year 12
- Essential English and Essential Mathematics sit a Common Internal Assessment (CIA) in year 12
- Usually more practical, hands-on subjects
- Please see your copy of the Senior Subject Handbook

VET (Certificate) courses 'Yellow Subjects'

- Certificate II Cookery
- Certificate II Furniture Making Practices
- Certificate II Engineering Skills
- Certificate II Retail Services
- Certificate II Applied Digital Technologies
- Certificate II Health Support Services (Transition to Certificate III Health Support)
- Certificate III Fitness (incorporating Certificate II Sport and Recreation)
- Certificate II Skills for Work and Vocational Pathways
- Certificate II Active Volunteering embedded into Social and Community Studies
- Please look in your child's SET Plan folder or Subject Selection Handbook for information, as there might be costs involved.

TAFE Courses on Tuesday/Wednesday/Friday

Certificate II Automotive Vocational Preparation (Wednesday) Certificate II Automotive Electrical Technology (Year 12 only) Certificate II Electrotechnology (Friday)

Certificate II Sport Coaching - Rugby League (Wednesday)
